Xatśūll & Ministry win Premier's Award

Xatśūll First Nation and the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation have won the 2022 Regional Impact B.C. Premier's Award for the first-ofits-kind ranch agreement with B.C.

The Province purchased the ranch, along with its Crown land range tenure, cattle, hay and equipment, for \$8 million. It is leasing the ranch to Xatśūll First Nation until a treaty is reached, at which point ownership will transfer to the Nation. The purchase agreement also includes a provision for a grant towards the operating costs for the ranch's first year.

The Regional Impact award recognizes groups, teams or

"We're proud to be able to work together with the province and lead the way towards reconciliation," says Councillor Mike Stinson. "We're happy that the excellent work of our teams is being recognized by the B.C. Premiers Awards and are looking forward to continuing to work towards reconciliation and improving life for our members."

Updates from the Band Office

FUNDING TOWARDS YOUTH CENTRE

Up to \$50,000 has been approved for the development of a youth centre. That funding will be used to hire an architect who will provide an initial concept and help with securing funding for the project. The location of the proposed youth centre is the current location of the Infrastructure trailer, which is set to be moved to the compound. The project was brought to C&C by the Xatśūll Youth Council.

"We're very excited to receive the support needed to take this project forward," says Communications Manager Max Winkelman who's been working with the Youth Council on the project.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL ASSISTANCE

Going forward, K-12 students living outside of the Xatśūll community will can receive the same back-to-school assistance that students living in the community do. This means that youth living outside the community will now receive \$50 if they're entering K-6, \$75 for grades 7-9, \$125 for grades 10-12 and an additional \$69 for girls eight and older. Application form and details will be available shortly. The program will

be reviewed in the future.

GRADUATION

Starting immediately, graduation incentives will be provided to all sponsored Xatśūll students upon successful completion of their Post-Secondary studies. For completing a certificate or 2-year program, the student will receive a \$750 graduation incentive, \$1,000 for a Bachelor's degree, \$1,500 for a Master's degree and \$2,000 for a PhD.

INFLATION DISBURSEMENT

Xatśūll Chief and Council approved a \$400 disbursement to all members. Disbursements will take place in January. Members will need to apply to receive it. A poster with more information on how to apply will go out by Dec. 16 at the latest.

ELECTORAL OFFICER HIRED

Electoral Officer Ron Laufer has been hired for the upcoming elections. Ron has extensive experience administering and observing electoral events both locally and globally. He serves as Lead Electoral Officer for various society and First Nations elections in British Columbia and Alberta. Questions about the election will be accepted closer to the election dates. SUPPORT FOR TRIPLEX FUNDING APPLICATION

Chief and Council voted to support the Housing Department in an Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) funding application towards a threeunit multiplex at 4058 Mountain House Road. The proposed triplex is for three approximately 1,000 square feet three bedroom units. The funding requested from ISC will be \$600,000 which represents approximately 58.5 per cent of the proposed budget. We will provide further updates if the funding request is approved. UPASS SUPPORT Chief and Council approved a motion to extend coverage toward UPass fees for students attending the University of BC (UBC) and Thompson Rivers University (TRU). The mandatory fee is approximately \$150 per semester, per student. The available Indigenous Services Canada (ISC)

funding for post-secondary programs will absorb the fee. It is unclear if this fee was historically excluded by ISC. Coverage of the fee was also amended in the policy to be covered going forward and will be applicable to all postsecondary institutions that have a similar, mandatory program.

RESEARCH APPROVED FOR NEW SPECIFIC CLAIM

TerraVita Law has been hired to conduct Specific Claims research on the IR2 Highway Specific Claim (35 acres). The funding for this research is coming from Canada, not Xatśūll. Xatśūll has paid off CMHC mortgages

Xatśūll First Nation has paid off the remainder of the CMHC mortgages. The amount that had still been outstanding was \$289,000.

"Paying off the mortgages has been a priority for Chief and Council," says Kukpi7 Sheri Sellars. "As members were able to hear at the audit meeting on Dec. 6, Xatśūll now has no long-term debt and we're in a very strong financial position."

Paying off the debt also has advantages for housing. With Xatśūll no longer tied to CMHC through the mortgage debt, the Nation has greater freedom to selfdetermine, plan and create its own programs for homes in the community.

"With the debts to CMHC paid off, our housing department does not have to report to CMHC anymore. This will free up time to deal with the growing need for housing for our members."
